There has been lots of talk, discussion, and argument in the N news groups about the Atlas code 55 track and MicroTrains wheels. Since the track is not legal for modules (although Peco code 55 is, since Peco "cheated"), I just want to summarize what was said about wheels.

First, the fact that MicroTrains wheels hit the spike heads on Atlas code 55 track is caused by Micro-Trains not being in compliance with the standards. Atlas track does meet standard. This has lead to a large discussion of regular vs. low profile wheels. The overwhelming opinion is that low profile wheels operate better on track. It doesn't matter if we are referring to home layouts or Ntrak modules, the results are the same. Low profile wheels also perform better through turnouts (switches). Maybe that is why MicroTrains now includes low profile wheels along with "Pizza cutter" wheels in there newer cars. The most amazing news, however, is that the new Atlas low profile brown wheels not only look better but also out-perform the Micro-Trains low profile wheels. I intend to purchase a pack and give it a try.
