
From the Prototype

Bulkhead Flat Cars

Bulkhead flat cars were a natural evolution of the flat car. Train breaking forces can cause loads to slide toward the engine, and if the load goes too far it may puncture the car ahead. Bulkheads also acted as a wall to make stacking easier. Below are some uses of these specialized cars and their lading.


Later, most lumber and building products were carried by center beam flat cars.




